## Help For Kids With Sensory Processing Disorder

(NAPSA)—If you've ever watched a child throw a tantrum in the grocery store, or witnessed a child slam into things, seemingly oblivious to pain, you may have seen the symptoms of sensory processing disorder (SPD). This condition affects 5 to 10 percent of children. Many parents whose children exhibit these and similar behavioral problems may be relieved to know that they are not alone. There may be a medical reason—and effective treatment is available.



Children with SPD benefit from occupational therapy with a sensory approach.

#### **Understanding SPD**

Whether you're eating, walking or reading, your ability to do so requires the integration of sensations. SPD occurs when sensory signals don't get organized into appropriate responses. This makes everyday tasks difficult, even though most individuals with SPD are just as intelligent as their peers and many are intellectually gifted.

#### Signs of SPD

A person with SPD may exhibit such symptoms as:

- Overly sensitive to touch, noises, smells or movement
- Floppy or stiff body; clumsy, poor motor skills
- Difficulty dressing, eating, sleeping or toilet training
- Frequent or lengthy temper tantrums
- Easily distracted, fidgety, withdrawn or aggressive
- Craves movement
- Easily overwhelmed.

Not everyone with these symptoms has SPD and not everyone with SPD has all these symptoms, but if your child has many of them, it may be time to see a doctor.

The road to spiritual, mental and physical healing is often long and difficult. Sometimes it takes us through long periods of dark days and long nights when it seems as though we are left to survive on our own. We struggle and strain and worry and work but it seems as though we will be left to our own abilities. There is great advice in today's verse: "When I said, 'My foot is slipping,' Your love, O Lord, supported me." Before the Psalmist fell, he recognized that he was facing a situation, having to solve a problem or make a decision that could have been disastrous to his well-being. So, he

did not wait until calling on God was too late - that his testimony and witness to the grace of God would be too late - he out maneuvered Satan. When he realized that his foot was slipping he called on God and God's love supported him! He did not need to ask for forgiveness - he asked God to intervene immediately and sustain him. As Paul brought his second letter to Timothy to a close, he must have had this verse in mind. "Timothy," he wrote, "the Lord stood at my side and gave me the strength that I needed, so that through me the message might be fully proclaimed and that all the Gentiles might hear it." Paul recognized how important it was for him to depend on God's strength and not his own. He knew that the battle was not his but the Lord's. So, rather than let his witness be destroyed, He called on God.



# Recipe Korner Comfort Food Fun





## **Sharing Caring And Safety**

(NAPSA)—When it comes to helping elderly relatives adjust to changes in their lives, even the most devoted adult child may not see all the signals or know what to do—especially if he or she is far away—but help can be available.

#### What To Do

To the extent possible, talk with your elderly parents gently and honestly about their wishes, their abilities and their options. These conversations are helpful and put the adult child in a better position to make decisions later when the parent may not be able to do so.

#### What Help Is Available


Fortunately, recent technological advances can make aging easier: Velcro fasteners, lightweight wheelchairs, devices to control appliances and dial telephone numbers. There are walk-in bathtubs for people who have difficulty climbing into an ordinary tub.

Also helpful can be an entirely private, ad-free website in which to manage private information associated with your elderly parent, from Social Security numbers to lists of online accounts and passwords or medications. It's a safe place to store and manage those binders full of information most people keep.

Social networks can be a place to confer, organize and connect about private family issues—the key, though, is privacy. On this one, the information is shareable with anyone you designate as a trusted participant, even relatives across the globe. That means everyone concerned about someone's care can have the latest information.

#### What You Get

There's a journal for keeping tabs on recent activities, a place to

trace medications, a to-do list, key contacts, a notepad for tracking key accounts and a place to upload important files and documents. This can be done securely and privately and without the worry of this information being shared beyond your control. Called CareZone, it can mean you don't have to worry about privacy, where the information is kept and stored, or how it's used.

The information can be available on any device you use to access the Internet—smartphones, tablets, Macs or PCs. The service is free through 2012 and will cost \$5 per month in 2013.

## Why Reduce Waste? by Lisa Luck



Reducing waste can seem impossible – especially with the summer right around the corner. Family picnics, camping and traveling tends to generate additional waste in the form of disposable tablecloths, napkins, plastic plates and cups. Quick to-go suppers can fill up a trash can with packaging that cannot be recycled. Many tons of packaging is discarded – mostly in a landfill. But the problem is bigger than just filling up a landfill.

All activity we engage in produces waste. Emissions in carbon dioxide and methane from the waste we generate slowly warm the earth. Increases in population and activity contribute to additional waste and emissions. Each person emits a minimum of 8.5 tons of carbon dioxide each year into the atmosphere – and depending on activity can emit much, much more. The most emissions come from transportation such as driving or flying. The second most emissions come from agriculture. Rainforests are being cleared to plant soybeans for cattle to meet the demand for beef. The third largest emitter of warming gasses are landfills – primarily because of food waste.

What can we do to decrease the amount of waste we generate and still enjoy family, friends, traditions and traveling? Can we still continue to enjoy our lives yet reduce the amount of waste we generate? Can a birthday party be celebrated without balloons, wrapping paper, plastic tablecloths and still be a happy birthday? Most of us have literally "bought in" to products of convenience we feel are time-savers. The money we are willing to spend to do less tedious work increases daily. So does the garbage. We must find ways that we can reduce the amount of waste we generate.

Unless one knows something about garbage it is hard to find a reason to reduce the amount of garbage one generates. Realizing that human activity is warming the atmosphere seems like the first step in realizing why it is important to reduce our waste stream. Becoming cognizant that we directly impact on the earth through our behaviors are a great motivator for us to make changes in how and what we do on a day-to-day basis.

For the sake of the environment, we need to rethink our purchases and reduce the amount of products we purchase. We can reduce waste and lessen emissions into the atmosphere if we all throw away less. We can throw away less by buying less. Being attentive to how much waste each purchase generates can help us reduce waste. 

### A Dog Trainer's Top Tips to Support Pets Through Life Stages

- Consistency is key: Training is beneficial for your pup through all stages of life and it's never too late to learn new skills. 
energy. Training sessions are great for both physical and mental stimulation.

- Playtime with a purpose: Outside of dedicated training time, puzzle toys and chew toys can keep your pet mentally stimulated and eliminate pent-up energy, which can result in unwanted behaviors. Puppies and senior dogs can benefit from enrichment such as toys that are easier to chew, while senior dogs may prefer to avoid games such as fetch that require large amounts of energy exertion. 



## Expert Tips For Discovering Your Family's History

(NAPSA)—If you're like many Americans, you have questions about your family history. Now, genealogy experts Kenyatta Berry, Joshua Taylor and Mary Tedesco from "Genealogy Roadshow" on PBS offer some advice for researching your family's history:

1)Collect as many oral histories as possible. Your living ancestors have information and stories to share. Interview them and record their stories.

2) Gather all the photos and documentation that you can. Items might include birth, death and marriage certificates; diplomas and other school documents; military service documents; Communion or other social, service and religious documents; and real estate documents.

3) **Begin a secondary search.** Fortunately, many ancestryrelated documents, such as the U.S. Census, military documents, immigration lists and newspaper archives are now digitized and available on the Internet at little or no cost.

4)**Consult with outside sources**, such as librarians, historians, genealogy organizations and databanks to find access to resources.

5) **Work backward.** It's generally easier if you begin with the present day and go back through time.
